Chronic Obstructive Pulmonary Disease (COPD) exacerbations are the second leading cause of preventable hospitalisations in Australia¹. Research shows that your patients are more likely to have an exacerbation during the winter months.

Are you ready? Complete this checklist for each patient with COPD:

- ☐ Recall your patient
- ☐ Use CHAT to check for exacerbation symptoms:
 - Coughing more than usual
 - Harder to breathe than usual
 - Any change in sputum (phlegm)
 - Tired more than usual (less active)
- ☐ Schedule vaccinations (influenza and pneumococcal pneumonia)
- ☐ Review COPD medicines (see Stepwise Management of Stable COPD)
- ☐ Review inhaler device technique
- ☐ Develop a COPD Action Plan
- ☐ Refer to pulmonary rehabilitation
