

Puffer and Spacer

Method 1: Steps for using an inhaler with a spacer

- Assemble spacer (if necessary)
- 2. Remove the inhaler cap
- Hold inhaler upright and shake
- 4. Insert inhaler upright into spacer
- 5. Place lips around mouthpiece, forming a good seal
- 6. Breathe out normally into spacer
- 7. Press down on canister to release one dose
- 8. Breathe in slowly and deeply





- 9. Hold breath for 5-10 seconds, or as long as comfortable
- 10. Breathe out gently, away from mouthpiece
- 11. If an extra dose is needed, repeat steps 3 to 10
- 12. Take inhaler out of the spacer and replace cap

Method 2: If unable to take one deep breath (Tidal breathing method)

- 1. Assemble spacer (if necessary)
- 2. Remove the inhaler cap
- 3. Hold inhaler upright and shake
- 4. Insert inhaler upright into spacer
- 5. Place lips around mouthpiece, forming a good seal
- 6. Breathe out normally into spacer

- 7. Press down on canister to release one dose
- 8. Take 4 normal breaths in and out
- 9. If an extra dose is needed, repeat steps 3 to 9
- 10. Take inhaler out of the spacer and replace cap

How do I clean a spacer?

A reusable spacer must be cleaned before first use, and every 2-4 weeks thereafter.

- Pull spacer apart where possible
- Wash in warm soapy water and allow to drip-dry
- After washing, DO NOT rinse the spacer
- DO NOT dry the spacer with a cloth, as this can result in static build up inside of the spacer
- DO NOT put the spacer in a dishwasher

How long does a spacer last?

Check a spacer every 6-12 months for cracks or other damage. Replace as needed.
