For Ethan, research means the hope of one day becoming a policeman

Seven-year-old Ethan spent his early childhood very unwell and was misdiagnosed by doctors for many years. When he was finally diagnosed with bronchiectasis, a chronic and debilitating lifelong lung disease that experts understand little about, it only brought minor relief to his mum Lauren.



The impact on his day-to-day life takes a huge toll on the family, as does the knowledge that significantly more research is required to find new treatments to help those like Ethan who are living with this crippling disease.

For Ethan, the future is unknown, but Lauren remains positive and sees research as the best hope for him to live a long and healthy life.

Research means the hope that father of two, Michel, can defy the odds

Michel is one of the 13,800 Australians diagnosed with lung cancer each year. Lung cancer is the fifth most commonly diagnosed cancer in Australia and the leading cause of cancer death. Yet it receives only 5% of cancer research funding in Australia.



Michel's lung cancer diagnosis was shocking, as at 42 years old he was fit and healthy. He considers himself lucky as, due to research, he was able to access life-changing medication. Sadly, this isn't an option for most as there are significantly fewer treatment options for lung cancer.

Devastatingly, Australians diagnosed with lung cancer face a five-year survival rate of just 20%. There is a critical need to invest into ground-breaking research to uncover new treatments and hopefully one day, a cure.

"Research is the line between our reality and our dreams, they call it research, we call it hope. You take away research, you take away our dreams and hopes, it's that simple."

Leaving a gift of hope: Your questions answered

Having an up-to-date Will is the only way to ensure that your assets will go exactly where you want them to, and that your loved ones and the causes that matter to you will be provided for. Making a Will is not complicated and is a positive action that can bring you peace of mind.

When you include a gift in your Will, you often leave an even bigger impact than you ever thought possible. Every gift, no matter the size, will make a difference.

How can I include a gift to Lung Foundation Australia?

Leaving a gift in your Will is straightforward and a lasting way to keep supporting the causes that were important to you during your lifetime. To include Lung Foundation Australia in your Will, just take our following suggested wording to your solicitor or appropriate legal advisor when writing your Will.

What is the best type of gift to leave in my Will?

Many people choose to leave us a percentage or residual gift because they do not lose value over time and automatically adjust to the changes in the value of your estate. Even a small percentage after all your loved ones have been taken care of will make a significant difference.

If I already have a Will, can I add a gift or change it?

Yes, you can. A codicil form is a cost-effective way to amend your Will to include a gift to Lung Foundation Australia.

Giving to research saves lives and gives hope for a cure

The types of gifts you can leave in your Will

Residual gift a portion of your estate residue, which is the

amount left after your loved ones and expenses

have been provided for

Percentage gift a percentage of the overall value of your estate

Pecuniary gift a specified fixed amount of money

Specific gift a non-monetary gift. Can be in the form of other

property such as shares, investments, vehicles,

boats or items of jewellery

Can I change my mind?

Yes, you can and should update your Will if your circumstances change. Reviewing your Will every few years is important to ensure that it is up-to-date and reflects your wishes.

Do I need to tell you if I have included you in my Will?

We greatly appreciate and value every gift left to us in Wills. We would love the opportunity to thank you personally for your significant support to life-changing research. We often only find out about these generous gifts after someone has passed away. Knowing beforehand allows us to recognise your support and plan for the future.

Of course, we understand that your Will is a very personal matter and will respect your wishes if you choose to stay anonymous.

We strongly recommend that you always seek independent advice from a qualified legal advisor in preparation of your Will to ensure it reflects your wishes.

Suggested wording to include Lung Foundation Australia in your Will

To ensure that your Will reflects your wish to leave Lung Foundation Australia a gift, we recommend taking the below wording with you when you make or update your Will.

'I (insert name here) bequeath to Lung Foundation Australia ABN 36 O51 131 901 for its general purposes [Choose and insert the appropriate statement from the list below]

- the whole of my estate
- o (insert number) percentage of my estate
- o **the residue of my estate** (or% of the residue of my estate)
- o the amount of \$ (insert the value of your gift in cash)
- o **my** (insert name of asset e.g. shares, house)

free of all duties, and the receipt of the Secretary or other authorised officer for the time being shall be a complete and sufficient discharge for the Executor(s).'

Leaving your gift in your Will for general purposes allows us to direct your gift for the greatest impact in the fight against lung disease and lung cancer.
